Instead, our legislators increase our taxes to “feed the government beast” and wage an ideological war on businesses through taxation, regulation, and litigation.

It is time to “think outside the box” and take a close look at why we do that which we do with an eye on improving the lives of Kentuckians, especially those who struggle to make ends meet. ***We need someone in Frankfort who understands business and economics and the job creation process and is willing to stand up to entrenched political interests on behalf of the people.*** I will

How Can We Create More Jobs?

We can create more jobs by reducing the cost of doing business in Kentucky and providing a source of investment capital for new and existing small businesses. Measures that will help reduce the cost of doing business include eliminating the Alternative Minimum Calculation (AMC) and the taxes on business profit and capital gain; reducing the cost of health care and workers compensation insurance; and reducing the cost of regulation and litigation.

The ***Kentucky Small Business Investment Program*** and ***Community Venture Capital Funds*** (see www.rogerthoney.com) will provide financing for new and existing small businesses located within Kentucky. These funds will provide equity financing for businesses that may not be able to get financing from banks.

We also can create more jobs by ***reducing*** the excise taxes on cigarettes and alcohol. Many Kentuckians lost their jobs when these taxes were increased. Many people came into Kentucky to buy cigarettes and alcohol

when our taxes were lower than surrounding states. While they were here, they purchased gasoline, lottery tickets, and convenience items; ate in restaurants; shopped at malls; etc. We lost the income tax and occupational tax revenue from the jobs that Kentuckians lost; and we lost sales tax revenue, gasoline tax revenue, and lottery sales because fewer people now come into Kentucky to buy cigarettes and alcohol.

How Can We Reduce the Cost of Living?

We can reduce the cost of living by reducing government spending so that we can reduce taxes; by reducing the cost of health care and health insurance premiums; and by reducing the cost of doing business in Kentucky. Cost imposed upon businesses through government taxation, regulation, and litigation is passed along to us as higher prices, increasing the financial squeeze on low-income households just like a regressive tax. We also can reduce taxes by increasing user fees (those who receive the benefit pay more of the bill).

How Can We Reduce Government Spending?

Thinking-outside-the-box-type ways to reduce government spending include (1) creating more jobs to reduce spending on social programs (and expand the tax base); (2) replacing Medicaid and SCHIP with a medical credit card program (see www.rogerthoney.com); (3) changing welfare programs from hand-out-based to loan-based (provide a helping hand rather than a handout); and (4) reducing the cost of living to reduce the dollar amount of welfare assistance needed.

The Jefferson Republicans
